

As we prepare for major projects occurring with our physical plant, please excuse the mess in the narthex and general disruption to parish life over the coming weeks.

What's Happening This Week?

Prep work continues....(See ECF Corner)

Fr. Paul's ECF Corner

Well...the time has come. The social hall and "old rectory" are entirely prepped for demolition.

Over the past two weeks, the crew from CTC Demolition has been painstakingly gutting the buildings and repurposing, recycling, and scrapping everything they can to keep our costs down. I know many were concerned that everything in the hall would simply be trashed. This is not at all the case. Anything that was "of value" or "usable" was dealt with accordingly by CTC. They even came across a couple of icons that we had missed during our final walk through and set them aside for me as they "felt bad throwing out church stuff." Very kind and honest guys! Now we are simply waiting for the utility work to be finished.

We have a new contractor for the electric and he is working hard to get this job done quickly! We have an engineer lined up and working on the requisite sealed drawing of the "up to standard" electric upgrade. We plan to meet with PECO next week for final approval of the 800 amp system. I am very hopeful this job will go smoothly and be finished relatively quickly.

Regarding the "undocumented" sewer line coming from the old rectory... we are still in a waiting game with the township. As soon as the plumbing contractor gets the go-ahead, his work rerouting the sewer lines should take about a day or so. Sincerely, please pray that all is ok with that "undocumented" line and the town simply lets us cut and cap it.

Please do not be alarmed at the appearance of the hall. There is red spray paint all over it designating it a "demolition zone." This is for everyone's safety and for insurance purposes.

Thank you all for your support during this project. If all goes well with the town, by the liturgical new year we will be looking out at a lot of fresh, new green-space. Please keep me, the demolition crew/contractors, and the parish in your prayers as we await the next big, and FINAL, step in this HUGE project.
