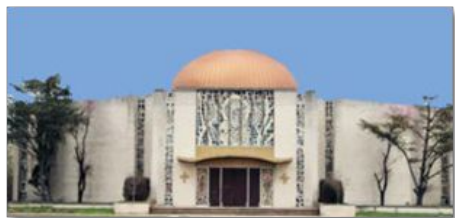

Church Slavonic at OLPH

It was recently brought to my attention that there is still a desire for Church Slavonic to be included in our Divine Liturgy. To this end, OLPH will officially be instituting the "last Sunday of every month Church Slavonic" plan discussed in the past. Having worked with our Director of Music, we have developed what I believe to be a well-rounded, yet robust, program combining English and Church Slavonic that is fitting of the Divine Services of the Byzantine Tradition. Here are some guidelines as to how Church Slavonic will be implemented at OLPH.

- There will be supplements provided with words *AND* music so **ALL** can participate
- Only hymns that are sung every Sunday will be in Church Slavonic to reduce feelings of isolation for those unfamiliar with the ecclesiastical language.
- In the spirit of Christian Catholicity, the *Creed* and *Our Father* will **ALWAYS** be in English
- Church Slavonic will be executed with a spirit of reverence fitting of Divine Worship and not as a "showpiece" or "novelty"

I believe that if we follow the above guidelines, this can indeed be a very fruitful experience for our parish and will add some variety to our liturgical life at OLPH. **The first official use of this program will be October 31, 2021.**

Father Paul's ECF Corner

As we prepare to discuss *2 Chronicles*, the *Letter to the Hebrews*, and the proper (liturgical) apertinances of the Temple, I find it fitting at this time to tell you that OLPH does not possess a proper chalice set! This is something I've been wanting to address and remedy since my arrival, but I was waiting for the Holy Spirit to guide me at the right time.

While we do have a vast array of chalices and Latin style pattens in the attic, the reality is they are not consistent with Byzantine usage (as prescribed by Rome for the Ruthenian Recension) and, in all honesty, they have seen far better days. Our parish only has one "set" to speak of and this set is not only incomplete, it is entirely mismatched! It has been pieced together by taking various items from different sets to "make it work." While this was great for a temporary "fix," when it comes to the sacred vessels used to prepare and hold the Precious and Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, we should have a "proper" set.

Recently, I happened upon a very nice chalice set of rather high quality from the well known Russian maker *Sofrino*.



This set includes all we need to have a proper celebration of the Eucharist! From left to right, we have: Spoon, Discos (with proper Nativity imagery), Asterisk, Chalice, Small Discos for the fraction of the Lamb (with proper "Lord of Glory" Cross imagery), Teplota (hot water) Vessel/Small Discos (with proper Panagia imagery) [Not pictured, but included, is the Lance with wooden handle for the fraction of the Lamb]. The entire set is Gold plated which is paramount to both reverence and safety as Gold does have antimicrobial properties and, with proper care, will not corrode as readily as other metals. This high quality set is priced at \$800, which is an amazing deal!!!

I am asking for a family, or perhaps several families in tandem, to underwrite the cost of these sacred vessels. This is a perfect opportunity to donate these items to the parish on behalf of a deceased loved one! If you would like to dedicate these items and underwrite the cost, please contact me. **WE ARE HALFWAY THERE ALREADY!! PLEASE CONSIDER UNDERWRITING THE COST OF THESE ESSENTIAL LITURGICAL ITEMS IN MEMORY OF A LOVED ONE!!**
